

# ANALYSIS OF CREW ON ATHENIA SEPTEMBER 1939

## Introduction by Brian Watson

Ronnie MacLean spent many years working on the lists of passengers and crew of Athenia and we were in regular correspondence.

Sadly he died before his work was complete and this document comprises the last version of his work on the crew list that he sent to me in January 2021. I have edited it to tidy it up but have not changed the contents. The main changes are to the styling and to move his ongoing notes to the end of the document.

This is without doubt the most complete crew list that has been completed to date and will remain as a memorial to Ronnie's persistence.

**Master - James Cook**, King's Commendation, 35 Herries Road, Pollokshields, Glasgow. Landed Galway. (Captain James Cook acknowledged Caulfield but wrongly said to be OBE) Contemporary photo (Philadelphia Inquirer Sep 5th 1939 p16). Captain of Letitia, sister ship of Athenia, handed over when converted to a Canadian Hospital ship, captain when Empire Brent? and when TSS Captain Cook, carrying emigrants to New Zealand, retired early 1954 from TSS Captain Cook.

**Chief Officer - Barnet (Barney) Mackenzie Copland**, OBE, Lloyd's War Medal, (32), 276 Strathmartin Road, Dundee (parents' address). Landed Greenock - Chief Officer M Barnett! (not under "crew") (Captain B Copland acknowledged Caulfield, 1958 book for repeated assistance on several knotty points) Lifeboat 14A (in Carroll, 2012) Often wrongly spelled Copeland on official documents. Torpedoed on Esmond?, became a Clyde Pilot.

**First Mate / First Officer - John Jamieson Emery**, (28), 26 Robsland Avenue, Ayr. Emery, first officer. Landed Galway (In Caulfield, 1958) (in Carroll, 2012) Flt-Lt John Jamieson Emery RAFVR, missing presumed killed 11th June, 1944, on an anti-submarine patrol over the Bay of Biscay in a Sunderland III (ML 760). Credit claimed by U-228 (Christophersen), Parents 21 Robsland Avenue, Ayr, Edward John and Margaret Emery, Wife of Doreen Emery of Biggin Hill, Kent. Born Perth. (CWGC) (aircrewremembered.com)

**Second Mate / Second Officer - K G Crockett**, 190 Baldwin Avenue, Glasgow. Landed Galway. (in Caulfield, 1958 and Carroll, 2012) Possibly RAFVR as Flt-Lt 68124?? Commissioned F/O May 16 1041 (Flight July 17 1941 p41), A J Crockett missing (Flight 30 Oct 1941 p328A).

**Third Mate / Third Officer - Colin Porteous**, (28?), 16 Ashdale Drive, Glasgow. Third Officer Porteous. Landed Galway. (Glasgow Herald Obituary 1911-1999) Captain Colin Porteous acknowledged in Caulfield (1958). Chief Officer then Captain last 2 years before scrapped, 1958 and 1959, of Letitia, sister ship of Athenia, as emigrant carrying TSS Captain Cook.

**Surgeon - Doctor Albert Sharman**, 19 Kelvin Court, Glasgow. Holiday relief - Not a regular member of crew but a well-known Glasgow doctor - made the same return trip every autumn as a holiday (in Caulfield, 1958) Landed as A Starman (male) British, not under crew, Quoted Greenock, Surgeon at Glasgow Samaritans Hospital, (Royal Samaritans Hospital for women?), in last lifeboat with officers and 104 passengers (Daily Herald 6th Sep 1939 via Benjidog) 3 Sep, 1939 Naval Signal? Barney Copland and Athenia's doctor on HMS Electra

**Nurse - A D ("Nanny") Weir**, 4 Melrose Street, Glasgow. Landed Greenock. (in Caulfield, 1958) Survivor (Orr cutting) Nurse Campbell?? (in Carroll, 2012) Stewardess - Not "nurse" Marion Campbell Athenia Relief Fund - later jailed for fraud - listed under stewardesses. A D Weir (nurse) Glasgow survivor (Guardian 6 Sep 1939 p3)

**Assistant Nurse - M K Moffat**, 56 Arisaig Drive, Glasgow. Landed Greenock. Survivor (Orr cutting) M K Moffat (Assistant Nurse) Glasgow survivor (Guardian 6 Sep 1939 p3)

**Hospital Assistant - H Hammond**, 25 Braid Street, Glasgow. Landed Greenock. Survivor (Orr cutting) H Hammone? (Hospital Assistant) Glasgow survivor (Guardian 6 Sep 1939 p3)

**Chief Purser - Alexander Hamilton Wotherspoon**, 27 Fotheringay Road, Glasgow. Landed Galway. Identifying his son's body in 1946 in Belfast - of 11 Hutchinson Drive, Bearsden 1938 a senior officer GG archives passenger list Athenia (in Caulfield, 1958) (says he was on Athenia when torpedoed, as purser, when identifying his son's body in 1946 - <https://wartimenu.com/person/eric-alexander-lockhart-blair-wotherspoon/>) (The Purser of the Athenia (not named) later on troopship Letitia (Chell, 1948, "Troopship"), on senior officers list as Purser A H Wotherspoon on Letitia 1930 on a GG archives passenger list - almost confirms chief purser in "Troopship" on Letitia

**Junior Assistant Purser - W A McClymont**, Rumling, Norbreck Drive, Giffnock. Landed Galway.

**Purser's Clerk - A J Wilson**, 92 St Andrews Street, Galashiels. Assistant Purser Wilson. Landed Galway.

**Purser's Clerk - Eric Bridges**, 12 Corunna Street, Glasgow. Landed Galway. Elie Bridges? Photo with 9 other crew in Galway (Daily Record 6th Sep 1939 via Benjido) Elie Bridges Scotsman?

**Purser's Clerk - B Doreton**, 47 Ashleigh Street, Glasgow. (Ashley Street??) No landing info. or other confirmation.

**Purser's Clerk - E G Sabatini**, 4 Dellfield Close, Watford, Herts. E Sabatini (male), British landed Greenock, not under "crew".

**First Radio Officer - David Don**, 113 Westburn Road, Cambuslang. Chief wireless operator Don. Landed Galway. Acknowledged source for Caulfield, 1958 AHOY item 96.

**Second Radio Officer - Donald McRae**, 2 Orchy Gardens, Clarkston. Macrae, second wireless operator. Landed Galway. AHOY? 2nd Radio Officer McCrae Boat 5 starboard motor boat (in Caulfield book)

**Third Radio Officer - H W Ramsay**, Congrett Manse, New Deer, Aberdeenshire. In hospital (Central Hospital Galway?) (Scotsman 7 Sep 1939 p11), First trip says Caulfield, 1958.

**Carpenter - James "Jimmy" Mitchell**, 52 Clynder Street, Glasgow. Landed Greenock. Survivor (Orr cutting) (WW2 People's War Donald Mitchell - son) J Mitchell (Carpenter) Glasgow survivor (Guardian 6 Sep 1939 p3)

**Carpenter's Mate / Ship's Joiner - Harry Logie**, 28 McLellan Street, Glasgow. Landed Greenock. Survivor (Orr cutting) H Logie (Carpenter's Mate) Glasgow survivor (Guardian 6 Sep 1939 p3)

**Bosun - William Harvey**, BEM, Lloyd's War Medal, 138 Milnpark Street, Glasgow. Landed Greenock. (Acknowledged Caulfield, 1958 but wrongly said to be OBE) W Harvey (male), British landed Greenock (not under "crew")

**Senior Bosun's Mate - Robert Young**, 16 McLean Street, Glasgow. Robert Young Boatswain's Mate Landed Galway (Acknowledged Caulfield, 1958 book) in WW1 at sea.

**Bosun's Mate - Donald McDonald**, 45 Boyd Street, Glasgow. Landed Galway.

**Lamps - Murdo McDonald**, 15 Water Row, Glasgow. Sailor Murdo McDonald Landed Galway.

**Stores - John McEwan** (19), 19 Ancroft Street, Glasgow. Landed Greenock J McEwen Survivor (Orr cutting) Deck Storeman. extensive quotes to journalists about passenger behaviour (Evening Star Wash p A-1 and A-5, 5 Sep 39) Guy McEwan (Liverpool Echo 5th Sep 1939 via Benjido) First out of Albert Docks (Evening Express Sep 5th 1939) J McEwen (Stores) Glasgow survivor (Guardian 6 Sep 1939 p3)

**Quartermaster - Alexander Campbell**, 91 Pollok Street, Glasgow. Landed Greenock. Survivor (Orr cutting) Alexander Campbell (Quartermaster) Glasgow survivor (Guardian 6 Sep 1939 p3).

**Quartermaster - Angus Graham** (28), 12 Aird Point, Stornoway and c/o McQueen, 11 McLellan Street, Plantation, Glasgow. Landed Greenock, and to Western Infirmary, Glasgow. Hand injuries Glasgow Western Infirmary, released evening of 5th September (Dundee Evening Telegraph 6th Sep 1939 via Benjido site). Angus Graham, Glasgow to Western Infirmary AHOY item 11. Quartermaster A Graham Survivor (Orr cutting) A Graham (Quartermaster) Glasgow survivor (Guardian 6 Sep 1939 p3) In Carroll (2012).

Presumably to Greenock and then hospital. No record. Had injuries before lifeboats being loaded. Passenger Survivor story - Martha Bonnett? Not on Scotsman crew list or Liverpool Echo cutting.

D McMillan Survivor (Orr cutting) Edward McMillan? quoted Medicine Hat News 6 Sep 1939 p5 Donald McMillan, Stornoway (Liverpool Echo 5th Sep 1939 via Benjidog) Possible mention in North Tolsta Historical Society. D McMillan (AB) Glasgow survivor (Guardian 6 Sep 1939 p3)

**Sailor - Norman Mackinnon**, (18) 24 Marvig, Isle of Lewis. Seaman M Mackinnon lookout when torpedoed (Carroll, 2012) ? Norman McKenna - sailor Landed Galway also possible Nigel McKinnon ? AHOY item 155. N McKinnon Liverpool Echo. Athenia survivor. Leading Seaman Norman Mackinnon RNR died 15 June 1942 age 21 on an HM trawler HMT Kingston Ceylonite, Lowestoft Naval Memorial, panel 8, column 2, son of Roderick and Marion MacKinnon, Stornoway, photo (Stornoway Gazette cited by lewistributes-3945.blogspot.com and lewiswwar2.blogspot.com) HMT Kingston Ceylonite on loan to US Navy, escorting Convoy KN-109, mined by U-701 off Chesapeake Bay, 18 crew of 32 lost (wrecksite.eu).

**Ordinary Seaman - James Simpson**, 313 Nuneaton Street, Glasgow. Landed Greenock. Survivor (Orr cutting) J Simpson (OS) Glasgow survivor (Guardian 6 Sep 1939 p3).

(Rockville Avenue? died 1992 (said he was Canadian passenger to "escape"? to Canada and then California (3945war site Mike Kemble). On City of Flint listed as crew (revised list of survivors - Scotsman 26 Sep 1939 p3). "signature" on Michael McShane's life jacket (National WW2 Museum, New Orleans) Lulu Sweigard eye witness account - a chef aboard the City of Flint heading to Halifax - Donaldson crew? Perhaps Thomas Graham Ottawa?? Not on Scotsman crew list or Liverpool Echo cutting.

**Baggage Master - J McHaffie**, 71 Glenapp Street, Glasgow. J McHaffie (male), British landed Greenock (not under "crew") Baggage Master McChaffie filmed with father? or son? Movietone Athenia Survivors in Scotland 7 Sep 1939.

**Bandmaster - D McRae**, 21 Springvalley Terrace, Edinburgh. No landing info. or other confirmation.

**Musician - Bernard Kammerin**, 33 Carlin Street, Glasgow. Bernard Kammin Orchestra Landed Galway. Kammrin? Bernard Kenmin, request for assistance to Athenia Relief Fund Bern Kammirn Liverpool Echo.

**Musician - E Gibson**, 9 Willowbank Street, Glasgow. No landing info. request for assistance to Athenia Relief Fund.

**Musician - Arthur Haslan**, Washington House, Kirkintilloch. Athur Haslan Orchestra Landed Galway.

**Musician - John Thomson**, 112 Kirk Road, Wishaw. Musician - George Thomson Landed Galway

**Interpreter - J Synelli**, 63 Standysmans Church Road, London. J Synelling Landed Greenock. J Synelling Survivor (Orr cutting) J Snyelling (Interpreter) Glasgow survivor (Guardian 6 Sep 1939 p3) Interpreter praised by Thomas McArthur for lighting matches to aid passengers' exit from 3rd class dining room, J Snyelling (Northern Whig and Belfast Post 7 Sep 1939 p5)

**Dispenser - L Jansen**, 35 Yewtree Road, Liverpool. L Jausen (male), British Landed Greenock not in "crew"

**Junior Engineer - William Russell**, 27 Cardell Road, Paisley. No landing info. Junior 2nd engineer William Russell (in Caulfield, 1958).

**Third Engineer - H Cockburn**, 4 Purdon Street, Glasgow. Landed Galway. Photo with 9 other crew in Galway (Daily Record 6th Sep 1939 via Benjidog)

**Fourth Engineer - J Port**, 5 Uist Street, Glasgow. Landed Greenock. Survivor (Orr cutting) J Port (Fourth Engineer) Glasgow survivor (Guardian 6 Sep 1939 p3)

**Sanitary Engineer - Robert (Bob) Bryson MacArthur Sim**, 321 Kingsbridge Drive, Glasgow. Landed Galway. AHOY item 80, Photo with 9 other crew in Galway (Daily Record 6th Sep 1939 via Benjidog).

**Chief/First Electrician - J Bennett**, 15 Walker Street, Paisley. G B B Bennett electrician landed Galway. Chief Electrician Bennet (Caulfield, 1958).

**Second Electrician - C Donaldson**, 28 Greenlees Road, Cambuslang. Landed Galway.

**Cinema Operator - Jim Clayton**, 17 Garturk Street, Glasgow. Jim Clayton, Wireless Operator. Landed Galway. J Clayton engineer Photo with 9 other crew in Galway (Daily Record 6th Sep 1939 via Benjidog).

**Stores - Alexander MacCuaig**, (56?), born Islay 1883, died age 92 1975? 123 Heywood Street, Glasgow. Alex MacCuaig engine stores Landed Galway. (also wartimememoriesproject.com).

**Greaser and Donkeyman - John Nelson Bekusch**, 7 Burnside Street, Glasgow. John Bekusch, greaser, Landed Galway. (also AHOY item 97) Transferred to Letiita after two weeks.

**Greaser and Donkeyman - James McConnell** (21?), 12 Ross Street, Glasgow. 1918-1963. Landed Greenock. Survivor (Orr cutting) (photos discharge books Glasgow Maritime Museum) quotes in Pittsburgh Press 5 Sep 1939 p6, a J McConnell crew quoted? (Liverpool Echo 5th Sep 1939 via Benjidog) James McConnell (Greaser and Donkeyman) Glasgow survivor (Guardian 6 Sep 1939 p3).
